RE: Administrative Officer Report

Please accept my Administrative Officer Report for April 2017. During the past month, my efforts have been devoted to project work; holding budget preparation meetings with the Finance Director and staff; project meetings with department heads; Board of Commissioners meeting preparation, attendance, and follow-up; Budget Committee meeting preparation and attendance, and a host of day-to-day administrative tasks. I also worked with the Greater Eastern Oregon Development Corporation (GEODC) on the structuring of meetings for the Equity Fund Loan Committee. I supervise ten employees and devote time each week to supervisory duties.

Please find the following description of the primary projects with which I am currently engaged or plan to start in the relatively near future.

- Fiscal Year 2017-2018 budget preparation and presentation. Budget Committee meetings were held on April 25-27, 2017, and staff devoted a significant amount of time on the preparation of the budget. This year, the narrative in support of budget requests that was submitted by departments was included in the Budget books provided to the Budget Committee. Budget books were also posted to the Morrow County website. Staff has made a concerted effort to make our budget document and process more accessible to the public through our website. A public hearing on the budget is scheduled for May 17. This is one week later than initially planned; however, this timeline still keeps us on track to adopt our Fiscal Year 2017-2018 budget by the end of the current fiscal year. The budget is scheduled for adoption in June.
- <u>North Morrow County facility planning</u>. This project will become a top priority as the bulk of our work on budget preparation has been completed. I have assembled a staff project management team. The team will create a list of options and potential path forward for this project, and present this to the Board of Commissioners when it is ready.

- Ordinance regarding road right-of-way permits. This item was last discussed at the County Court's September 7, 2016 meeting. At the time, I presented draft language to authorize the Public Works Director and his or her designee to approve permits for construction in the right-of-way. The Court expressed a desire to incorporate an appeal process. Draft ordinance languages is currently being reviewed at the staff level, and I plan to bring updated draft language to the Board for consideration in the future.
- <u>Rodeo Committee organizational structure</u>. Staff has continued discussions with representatives from the Oregon Trail Pro Rodeo (OTPR) Committee focused on the Rodeo Committee entering into a contractual relationship with the County, as opposed to operating with County affiliation. I will provide an update at our May 3, 2017 BOC meeting.
- <u>Emergency Management Planning.</u> The Board held a work session on April 19, 2017 with Emergency Manager John Bowles. At that meeting, we discussed training that was available on the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) website. We are scheduled for a follow-up work session on May 17, 2017.

Projects that are upcoming include:

- <u>Financial Policies Update</u>. At the March 15, 2017 Board of Commissioner work session, the Board gave staff direction to work with the Treasurer to draft written financial policies. I anticipate that this project will begin in July.
- <u>Sister County discussion with Benton County.</u> This remains an upcoming project. I am waiting to hear from Benton County representatives to talk about scheduling the next step.
- <u>Morrow County Code Update</u>. The Morrow County Code needs to be updated to reflect ordinances that have been adopted after 1986. This update will help to communicate ordinance requirements that have been adopted by the County Court/Board of Commissioners.
- <u>County smoking policy draft</u>. At the September 28, 2016 County Court meeting the County Court directed staff to draft a policy to make the campus smoke-free outside of designated smoking areas. A draft of that policy will be brought before the Board of Commissioners when directed.

April 2017 Meetings:

- <u>April 6:</u> I attended the Heppner Chamber of Commerce meeting and provided a report on Morrow County activities.
- <u>April 10:</u> I attended the Board of Commissioners special meeting at the Port of Morrow concerning facility construction project management.
- <u>April 11 and 24:</u> I met with the Willow Creek Valley Economic Development Group (WCVEDG) subcommittee on creating an incentive program for refurbishment of existing housing stock in order to provide additional rental housing.
- <u>April 12-14</u>: I attended the Spring Oregon City/County Managers Association Conference.
- <u>April 5, 19, 26</u>: I attended the Board of Commissioners regular meetings.
- <u>April 25-27:</u> I attended the Budget Committee meeting.

I would like to have it noted, or amended as need be, that while the original loan completed in 2011 for the Millers, now Blue Mountain Manufacturing, was originally approved with a 'term of up to 10 years', that the original loan was actually amortized over 84 months (7 years), at closing. As I am only modifying the original note, I would like the record to indicate that the new, modified term, matches the original term of 7 years, and not the 10 years, as I had explained at the commissioners meeting. The original loan amount, and interest rate, of \$85,000 and 6.50% respectively, are the same as the original note.

Also if we could please, may we have a copy of the minutes, from the April 26th, meeting for our loan file?




